This risk assessment follows Government guidelines as of 11th July 2020 and refers to singing outdoors from the performers perspective. This will be reviewed and shared as necessary and as measures are released, potentially regarding singing indoors

<u>Managing Performance</u>		
Limiting singing in groups or in front of audiences to professionals only (i.e. for work purposes only).	Band charging a Fee therefore deemed Professional purposes	N/A
Observing extended social distancing between each singer, and between singers	Band well spaced apart and facing forwards, not facing each other. Social distance marked with guide tape (yellow / black) 1m+	Low
Limiting singing in groups to group sizes which are as small as possible in one discrete space, and only considering increasing this number if a comprehensive risk assessment has been conducted which includes but is not limited to: – the size of the space – the ventilation levels within the space – the positioning of singers within the space	Band consists of 6 members Outdoor in large garden area – ventilation level high Singers positioned as above	Low
Operating outdoors wherever possible.	Outdoor performance only at present	Low
Within the fixed team, positioning side-to-side or back-to-back and avoiding singing face-to-face wherever possible.	See above	Low
Regularly cleaning desks, for example, sound, lighting, mics and battery packs.	All equipment cleaned before and after performance	Low
	Band will arrive and set up in garden with no contact between staff or residents. Set up team will consist of no more than 2 and will remain apart at all times. On completion of the gig, 2 members of band will set down and leave the premises as quickly as possible	Low
<u>Managing audiences</u>		None
To maintain social distancing wherever possible in performing arts environments.	Audience remain inside the building at all times with band outside. Band to socially distance as above	Medium
	Management of audience bubble is the responsibility of the venue. In a care facility, If residents come outside, a minimum of 3m social distance between the performer and the audience is required (This will be marked by tape) Social distancing measures must be adhered to by all.	Medium
